This Call for Applications is addressed to **non-EU applicants who are not residing in Italy and are applying for a Visa at the Italian embassy or consulate, have a study qualification obtained abroad, and intend to enrol in the Master’s Degree Programme in ECONOMICS AND PUBLIC POLICY (EPP) for the Academic Year 2021-2022. Places available: 15**

Applications must be submitted **by 30 June 2021** and applicants shall be subject to a verification of their academic background that will be carried out **based on their study qualification with a possible interview and test by remote.**

Applicants with an Italian qualification, as well as EU applicants (regardless of their residence) and Non-EU students regularly residing in Italy and possessing a degree released in a foreign country, shall apply for the degree programme in Economics and Public Policy (EPP) by following the procedure indicated in a specific Call for Applications reserved for them and available on the website <https://www.unimore.it/bandi/StuLau-Lau2V.html>.

2. Requirements

Applicants are required to possess:

- a) Bachelor’s degree deemed suitable and awarded before 20 December 2021
- b) As the degree programme is taught entirely in English, applicants are required to demonstrate at least a B2 level knowledge of the English language, proven by an international language certificate,

in accordance with the Common European Framework of Reference. A list of the main language certifications recognised by UNIMORE is available on the website www.clamore.unimore.it/it/certifications/info

alternatively

a declaration issued by the home University (Language Centre or Department), confirming the required language skill level, if it cannot be inferred by the study programme, is also accepted

alternatively

the examination Board invites the applicant for an **interview, by 16 July 2021**, if it deems that the English language skill is not comparable to B2 level, based on the documents attached to the application regarding the study programme

- c) basic knowledge in the economic-historical, mathematic-statistic, and corporate-legal disciplinary fields, as well as an academic background and training/professional experience pertinent to the nature of the Master's degree programme. Please refer to the Appendix to this call for applications. The examination Board assesses the documents attached to the application and if it's necessary invites the applicant for a **test and an interview, by 16 July 2021**, to be taken by remote.

3. Submitting an online application for evaluation

To submit the application, students must:

- register on www.esse3.unimore.it by clicking on the "Registration" section (menu tab) to get username and password and access the Reserved Area. Please check that the e-mail address provided is correct in order to receive any future communications
- after logging in, choose *Registered/Student Area* from the menu tab and choose "**Assessments and tests**".
- choose the EPP selection and answer "Yes" to question "*Are you an international student with a foreign qualification, residing abroad and in need of a visa of the Italian Embassy/Consulate?*"
- fill in the online application and attach the following documents:
 1. **degree certification**. Students who have not yet obtained the qualification must state the expected awarding date. The list of the exams passed, the grades obtained and any future exams shall also be reported in the attachments.
 2. **exam content outline for each exam taken** (it may also be submitted in English)
 3. **European format CV** with email address and telephone number
 4. **international language certificate stating at least a B2 level in English**
or, alternatively
declaration issued by the home University (University Language Centre or Department) stating that the applicant has achieved the required language level.
 5. **motivation letter** (max 1,500 characters, including spaces), indicating the reasons for choosing the study programme.

IMPORTANT: the application is deemed actually submitted only **after the applicant has saved the data**

and answered **YES** to the question “Do you want to submit your application now?” The application may now be printed and kept as a personal reminder.

4. Amending or reopening an application for evaluation

Should you need to open the application again to change any data or add documents before the assessment begins and within the deadline of **30 June 2021** send an e-mail to the Registrar’s Office segrstud.economia@unimore.it

5. Assessment Results

The examination board, appointed by the Council of the “Marco Biagi” Department of Economics, assesses the qualifications and the documentation attached to the application. Applications are evaluated in the order of submission. The assessment results will be made available to applicants on www.unimore.it/bandi/StuLau-esiti.html.

The following results will be published **by 10 July 2021**:

- **PASS**: the student’s academic background is deemed suitable and the curricular requirements are met; as a consequence, if the study qualification has been awarded, the applicant may complete the final enrolment in the programme by following the instructions outlined in 6.
- **ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS**: the Board identifies any deficiencies in the academic background and invites the student for an interview, after taking a written test (see the Appendix to this call).
- **FAIL**: it is the result of not meeting the curricular requirements and/or deficiencies not overcome in the initial personal background. In this case, the applicant will not be allowed to enrol.
- **INCOMPLETE APPLICATION**: if the Board decides that no assessment can be made as the required documentation is incomplete, the application is labelled as “incomplete application” and it is automatically reopened and labelled as “not final application”. Applicants shall attach the missing documents and finally close the application for a new assessment by **30 June 2021**.

The following may also appear:

- **APPLICATION NOT FINAL**: the student has not confirmed the application by clicking on the field “Do you want to submit your application now?” and therefore it cannot be assessed.

FOR ASSESSMENT: the application has been correctly submitted by the applicant, but the examination Board has not yet assessed the submitted application

6. Enrolment

6.1 Pre-enrolment on University for the purpose of obtaining a student visa

As indicated in the ministerial circular for access to study programmes, which is published every year on the website www.studiare-in-italia.it/studentistranieri/, Non-EU applicants residing abroad and requesting a visa

must pre-enrol on the UNIVERSITALY website by clicking on the link <https://www.universitaly.it/index.php/registration/firststep>.

The pre-enrolment application is automatically sent to UNIMORE for validation. UNIMORE will notify the Italian Consular Authority in the event of admission to the study programme.

Applicants have to upload the following documents on the University website:

- their passport

Any further documents relating to their academic qualification may also be attached, including:

- **declaration of value**, issued by the Italian Embassy/Consulate in the country to which the school issuing the qualification belongs
or, alternatively
- **statements issued by ENIC-NARIC centres** such as the comparability certificate issued by the *Centro di informazione sulla mobilità e le Equivalenze accademiche* (CIMEA) - website www.cimea.it/it/index.aspx For further information, visit the website www.cimea.it/it/servizi/attestati-di-comparabilita-e-certificazione-dei-titoli/attestati-di-comparabilita-e-di-verifica-dei-titoli-diplome.aspx

Please contact the reference Embassy/Consulate as soon as possible to check the requirements and the documents needed for the visa to be issued.

6.2 Enrolment

To enrol in the EPP Programme, applicants must:

- have completed the pre-enrolment procedure on the University website
- obtain a student visa for Italy in time for the enrolment.

Enrolment: **12 July to 20 December 2021.**

The following documents must be submitted for enrolment:

1. Bachelor degree diploma, translated and legalised by the Italian Embassy/Consulate
2. Declaration of value of the university degree, issued by the Italian Embassy/Consulate in the country to which the school issuing the qualification belongs or, alternatively, declaration issued by ENIC-NARIC centres
3. Degree certification, issued by the University awarding the degree
4. Receipt issued by the post office in Italy, certifying the filing of the application for a residence permit
5. Passport
6. Passport photo

After verifying the correctness and completeness of the documents submitted by the student, the forms for the payment of tuition fees (academic year 2021-2022) will be made available on the applicant's personal page on Esse3 and the Registrar's Office will confirm the enrolment once the first instalment has been paid.

IMPORTANT

Please note that the PAYMENT DATE indicated on the electronic payment receipt applies.

Payments reporting a date later than 20 December 2021 on the receipt will not be deemed valid for enrolment purposes.

PLEASE NOTE According to AgID (Digital Italy Agency), the payment may be made by the payment service provider on the day following the payer's request. This would preclude the enrolment.

8. Contributions and benefits
